
Zoning Determination Instructions


Instruction for how to determine a property's current zoning.

1. Go to gis.hamiltontn.gov or click here



3. In the top right hand corner type your address and click the search icon.



4. On the left side your property address will appear. Click on your address. The map will zoom into your property.




5. Zoom in further or zoom out by clicking on the "+" and "-" symbols on the left side of the map. Double check that this is your property by looking at the address and surrounding streets.




6. In the bottom left side of the screen are 3 tabs: Home, Layers and the property address. Click on "Layers". A new panel will appear.

7. Towards the bottom of the layers is a layer called "Zoning". Click the box to activate this. Click the "+" sign beside "RPA Zoning" to expand the zoning layer options.



8. You will not need all of these layers and can turn them off by clicking the boxes. For our purposes, you will only need the "Zoning Type Labels", "FBC_Boundary" and "Zoning" layers on.





The zoning is the red text (noted here with a teal box). The color around the text is the limits of that zoning. All zoning can be looked up in Chapter 38 of the Chattanooga City Code, https://library.municode.com/tn/chattanooga/codes/code of ordinances?nodeId=CH38ZO.

Euclidean Zoning (outside of the Downtown) typically has a 2 part zoning abbreviation (image on the left). To look up the name and regulations associated with the zoning, read through Chapter 38 of the City Code.

Downtown Form-Based Code (FBC) Zoning has a 3 part zoning abbreviation (image on the right). To look up the name and regulations associated with the zoning, read through Chapter 38 of the City Code. The FBC naming convention is broken down as follows:

- 1. The first letter in the zone stands for the location of the parcel.
 - ➤ D Downtown Core
 - ➤ R River
 - ➤ U Urban
 - ➤ E Urban Edge
 - ➤ B the Bend
- 2. The second letter refers to the use.
- 3. The number refers to the maximum allowed height for a structure on the property.
