FOR PROPERTY TAXES AND INTEREST ON TAX MAP NO. 128E-A-005, BACK TO THE HUMANE EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY, FOR A TOTAL APPROPRIATION AFTER PAYMENT OF ALL DELINQUENT TAXES AND INTEREST IS RECEIVED NOT TO EXCEED \$271,200.00.
